What to expect from your free telehealth environmental health registry evaluation



1 Connect to a VET-HOME clinician via telehealth from the convenience of your home



2 Discuss your history of military environmental exposures and any related symptoms or concerns



3 Review your physical exam of record with your VET-HOME clinician



4 Visit your nearest VA facility for any recommended diagnostic tests



5 Receive a follow-up letter about your visit with copies of your test results and any additional recommendations

Your evaluation and exposure history will be documented in your VA health record.
